What Are Cookies

As is common practice with almost all professional websites, this site uses cookies, which are tiny files downloaded to your computer, to improve your experience. The Cookies We Use

- **Essential Cookies:** These cookies are necessary for the website to work properly. They enable core features such as security, network management, and accessibility.
- Analytics Cookies: These cookies collect information about how you interact with our site (including pages visited, traffic sources and IP address), to help improve site performance and user experience.
- **Functional Cookies:** These cookies collect data to remember choices you make to improve and give a more personalised experience.
- Marketing Cookies: These cookies may be used to deliver relevant advertisements and track the effectiveness of marketing campaigns.

Email newsletter related cookies
